For the first time in it's 146 year history, the Stanthorpe Show had to be postponed in 2022. Previously the show had been cancelled twice, once in 1918 for service men going to World War 1 and secondly in 1949 for servicemen going to World War 2.

To select new dates is no mean feat. Several ducks have to line up in a row including approval from our governing bodies being Qld Ag. Shows and the Darling Downs subchamber. Approval was also sought from the show societies who have shows on the proposed weekend end and in our case it was Dirranbandi and Goombugee-Haden.

Most importantly though, was the ability of the Showmen's Guild of Australasia to provide us with rides and attractions for a side show alley. This they have guaranteed so we will still be able to provide all the fun of the fair.

The Stanthorpe Agricultural Society have confirmed all of our show entertainment which will include our beloved pig races, puppeteer, magicians, fashion parades and fireworks, as well as some attractions to get the heart racing including FMX freestyle motorcross and a motorcycle barrel race.

Now a fully enclosed space, the Ringmaster's Café dining room has had the walls painted and a new flake flooring applied which looks fantastic.

A feature wall carries the grandstand mural that initially hung over the door to the kitchen.

Adjoining the exhibition centre verandah, this space is now a fantastic space to host smaller events that do not need the full exhibition centre space.

This project forms part of the mezzanine floor project overhead, can could only have been made possible by grant funding through the Australian Government's Regional Agricultural Show Development program.

The Stanthorpe Agricultural Society received \$20,000.00 from the Southern Downs Regional Council through their Community Drought Recovery funding program.

The objectives of this program are to:

- support not-for-profit organisations impacted by the drought
- stimulate the local economy by enabling non-forprofit organisations to engage local contractors and purchase from local businesses
- support healthy and socially inclusive activities through the development of sport, recreation and community facilities.

At Stanthorpe Showgrounds, this funding was spent on improving drainage around the easter boundary of Stockman's Arena and to prevent flooding from the skillion roof overflow.
