All exhibits to be staged by 10:00am, Friday 30 January 2026.

Exhibitors to leave the area for judging.

**Entry fees**

\$1 per entry with a CAP of \$20.

Fees to be paid when delivering entries, please have the correct money.

**Judging**

Judging to commence 10:00am.

The area will not be open to the public until judging has finished  
(approx. midday).

**Collection of entries**

Entries will be available for collection on Saturday, 31 January 2026 at 4:00pm

Gate admission fees apply on Friday & Saturday. Stanthorpe Agricultural Society members free.

## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

1. All exhibits, other than flowers arranged for effect – i.e. floral art classes, must be grown by the exhibitor.
2. Allocation of prizes will only be made to those entries deemed worthy of a prize by the Judge. The Judge's decision shall be deemed final.
3. If an exhibit has been placed in the wrong class, the Judge may direct the Steward to place the exhibit in the correct class and re-judge that class.
4. GST implications are as those listed in the front of the Schedule.
5. The Chief Steward has the discretion to move an exhibit from a Novice Section to an Open Section if the exhibit does not meet the Novice Section guidelines or has accidentally been entered into the wrong section by the exhibitor.

## **DEFINITIONS**

1. Bowl is defined as a circular or oval vessel whose smallest diameter measures across the top more than the height.
2. A trough is defined as a "narrow receptacle whose length is greater than the width".
3. A collection is judged on quality, freshness and variety, not quantity of any variety.
4. A container is defined as any vessel that can be used for an arrangement.
5. Distinct means each bloom must be different.

**EXHIBITORS, WHERE POSSIBLE, TO EXHIBIT CUT FLOWERS IN GREEN BOTTLES – PARTICULARLY DAHLIAS AND ROSES. NOT PAINTED BOTTLES. GREEN WINE BOTTLES ARE SUITABLE.**

## **FLORAL ART CLASSES**

### **Accessories allowed with any arrangement**

- 1. Accessories including bases, drapes, containers, title cards & mechanics are permitted with any arrangement.**
- 2. All arrangements must have natural plant material predominating and NO SOIL.**
- 3. All fresh plant material should be staged with cut ends in water or water retaining material (e.g. florist foam), unless the plant material will remain in a satisfactory condition for the length of the show.**
- 4. Due to the current space constraints, all floral arrangements to be no more than 50cm wide and 35cm deep when staged. EXCEPT "free expression" class, which for the 2026 Stanthorpe show, may be a maximum of 70cm wide and 40cm deep.**
