

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. All varieties to be correctly named.
- 2. Exhibits to be in the hands of the Stewards by 12 noon if possible on Thursday prior to the show.
- 3. All exhibits to be grown by exhibitor.
- 4. All cartons to be branded for the market in conformity with state regulations.
- 5. Each competitor shall mark on the end of his/her carton or tray, the class and exhibit number and the steward will also tack on the top portion of the card supplied showing the class and exhibit no.
- 6. The judges have the privilege of using one or more fruits in any exhibit for cutting up etc and will use their own discretion in the awarding of prizes.
- 7. Those exhibits approaching perfect uniformity of both size and form will have the best chance of obtaining maximum points awarded.
- 8. No unauthorised person will be allowed in the pavilion whilst judging is taking place.
