CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Exhibitor to list all entries on the Stanthorpe Show General entry form. Bring this entry form and entry fees with your entries to the Handcraft display area in the Exhibition center between
2. **8am - 5pm on Tuesday 27th January.** This is the normal Handcraft procedure and avoids confusion by keeping all registration recordings in the one place. 2. Maximum of 2 entries per person per Class, UNLESS STATED OTHERWISE. All care will be taken with exhibits, but responsibility for any insurance rests with the exhibitor.
3. Handcraft entries must not be more than two years old, and the item/s must be the exhibitor's own work. Items entered in previous Handcraft section at a Stanthorpe Show are not accepted. Lego entries must be original work for this Show. Past entries adapted, not accepted.
4. OPEN classes are for previous winners as well as any other entrant choosing to enter.
5. NOVICE classes are for those who have not won a prize in that class previously.
6. Please read Classes carefully for any instructions regarding judging of presentation and size. Oversize items not accepted.
7. The stewards reserve the right to move an exhibit to another category if, in the judge's opinion, the exhibit is incorrectly placed.
8. The stewards reserve the right to combine categories if insufficient entries received in those categories.
9. Any item, deemed by Stewards, not to comply with the definition of Class entered will not be presented for judging
10. Judges assess all exhibits. A strong emphasis will be placed on indications of effort in creativity and design in producing a quality entry in terms of colour, durability, and practicality. Entries need to be in line with the choice of materials and the implementation, as noted, in any requirements for a Class. These conditions are inclusive for Classes in Open, Novice and all Junior Classes. Age/ability factors taken into account with Junior entries. Cleanliness in presenting work is essential.
11. Prizes are awarded at the judge's discretion.
12. ALL entries and prize money must be collected between **10:00am – 12:00pm SUNDAY 1st February 2026.** Uncollected items and prizes will not be taken to the show office. No security provided nor responsibility accepted for uncollected items.
13. Uncollected prize money will be held by the Handcraft subcommittee and if not claimed **WITHIN THREE MONTHS** will become a donation to the Handcraft subcommittee for their ongoing operation and future prize money. Prizes and prize money will not be mailed.


To celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the Stanthorpe Agricultural Society, we have selected the Maypole from years past to carry our colourful display!
