### Entry fees

Stanthorpe Super Steer:

\$25 per head for single entry, \$20 per head for 3+ entries.

Stud cattle:

\$15 per head for single entry classes 2-11, \$10 per head for interbreed classes.

### Delivery of entries

All cattle must be on the grounds by 8am Saturday 31/01/26.

NOTE: Fenced stalls. Stall bedding (straw) provided. Please bring your own water tub and feed.

### Entries close

Sunday 25/01/26 No late nominations accepted.

Steers weighed

Saturday 31/01/2026 at 8:00am.

### Judging

All judging will be on Saturday Stud Cattle commencing 9:00 am on Saturday 31/01/26.

Gate admission fees apply on Friday & Saturday. Stanthorpe Agricultural Society members free.

# Conditions of Entry

1. All stud cattle entered throughout this section must have been registered in their respective herd books.
2. All cattle must be handled and led by halter and appropriate nose clip.
3. If doubt should arise in the mind of the judge in any class as to the classification of the competing animal, the matter should be referred to the Stewards in that subsection for consideration.
4. Ages of cattle entered for competition shall be taken as at 30/01/26. Calf to be entered single class or with mother only.
5. All cattle to be bona fide property of exhibitor.
6. Exhibitors to provide their own feed.
7. Every care and assistance given to exhibits but the Society will not be responsible for any losses, death or accident to stock.
8. Under no circumstances will animals be allowed to be let out of the handler's control.
9. TUBERCULOSIS: Cattle must originate from a property classified by the Chief Veterinary Officer of the State of Origin as Origin free of Tuberculosis.
10. BRUCELLOSIS: cattle must be confirmed Free tested negative or monitored negative.
11. TRICHOMONIASIS: Breeding cattle from a herd in which Trichomoniasis is not known to exist.
12. Breeds exhibiting only one male or female, shall only be awarded Junior or Senior Champion ribbons, but are eligible for interbreed competition.
13. The Committee reserves the right to judge single class entries together.
14. Stanthorpe Super Steer - Led Steer weighing will commence at 8:00am sharp Saturday 31/01/26.
15. Normal animal husbandry requirements apply to animal health and disease recognition.
16. All animals are to be in good health.
17. Bovine Johne's Disease specific requirements:
  - a) Cattle must be minimum JBAS 6 status.
  - b) Cattle must be accompanied by a National Health Declaration in addition to a National Vendor Declaration.
18. Segregation of JBAS 6, 7 & 8 cattle is required, Refer to Livestock Biosecurity Network advice for Show and Exhibitors for further information.
19. In the event of a suspected illness, animal is to be isolated and vet checked.

## **CONDITIONS**

1. The competition is for the purpose of education and encouraging cattle breeders.
2. Attendants and assistants to parade exhibits before a Judge in the most efficient manner.
3. The animal need not be owned by the parader, but must be exhibited in one of the general classes.
1. Points will be allocated for:
  - a) Ability of the handler to parade and control the animal.
  - b) Presentation of the animal.
  - c) Suitability of attire of the competitor.

## **RULES - Local show rules**

Competitor's age as at 01/05/26:

- Under 12 years
- 12 - 14 years
- 15 – 25 years

## **CONDITIONS**

1. Competitors under 18 years must have approval of parent or guardian to compete.
2. Competitors are to be a resident in Queensland for at least three months prior to the competition or attending an educational institution in Queensland unless they qualify under Rule (4).
3. All competitors are eligible to compete in the Young Judges Competition at the Stanthorpe Show, BUT to compete at the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies final the following rules must be observed:
  2. Their address has a Qld postcode.
  3. They have a Qld phone number.
  4. The competitor or their parents are active working members of that Show.
  4. National winners or persons on a National judging panel for that event are ineligible to compete.
