## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

---

1. A maximum of three (3) entries by one exhibitor in any class, except the classes of animals under 12 months of age.
2. Entry limits for Junior classes are as follows: a maximum of six (6) entries for each of these classes: 6001, 6002, 6006, 6007, 6011, 6012, 2016, 6017, representing junior does and bucks - 4 to 12 months.
3. All fullblood and purebred animals must be registered with the Boer Goats Breeders' Association of Australia (BGBAA) or Boer Goats Australia (BGA).
4. Johnes' Disease Region goats must not be introduced unless:
  - a. They are from a non-restricted herd or from a Johnes' free zone, Queensland is a protected zone
  - b. They are from a monitored negative (MN) or tested (TN) status herd established under an officially recognised market assurance program (MAP).
  - c. They are introduced from a non-assessed herd (NA) and the goats have been subjected to an AGID test resulting in a clean test within 30 days prior to introduction (for kids less than 12 months of age a test on the dam is suffice).
5. The animal/s entered in group classes must be entered in individual classes.
6. Animals may be checked for registration on arrival at the show. Identification can be carried out in the following ways:
  - a. Tattooing and tagging.
  - b. A stud tag combined with an NLIS approved metal tag, electronic button tag, or plastic swing tag.
7. Substitute animals may be entered but only one per class and these animals MUST be confirmed by the Chief Steward by 9am on the day of the show.
8. The use of hormones and/or tranquillizers and/or any other stimulants is strictly prohibited. Random testing of animals can occur at any show and if an exhibitor is found to be in breach of this condition of entry he/she/they will be reported to the Federal body of BGBAA or BGA.
9. An animal entered for exhibition shall be presented in the judging ring in its natural conformation and with normal show preparation. The exhibitor of any animal found to have undergone an operation or procedure, to change by exaggeration or minimisation the structure or natural conformation of any body part, will be disallowed from showing that animal. The exhibitor shall be reported to the relevant Federal Board for any further action.
10. Entries must be completed online before the closing date. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
11. All animals coming from tick-restricted areas must have relevant stock clearances. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to arrange for return permits and spraying of animals.
12. In the event of the judge deciding that the exhibits in any class or Championship are not worthy of a prize, no prize shall be awarded.
13. Exhibitors are encouraged to wear white coats whilst in the Judging Ring.
14. Exhibitors should not have their stud name on any apparel when in the judging ring.
15. No stud signs are to be erected at the show until judging is completed. Areas will be allocated for stud signs.
16. All exhibitors should be aware of and comply with show ring protocols attached to this schedule.
17. On the day of the show: All entries must be owned by the exhibitor for a minimum of three months and registered with the BGBAA or BGA. Unless entered into the commercial classes.
18. Age of entries will be as of the day of the show.
19. Stewards have the right to alter the number of classes, according to the number of animals entered.
20. The Chief Steward will coordinate an inspection of all animals prior to the commencement of judging. Any animal not meeting the standard will not be allowed entry and will be dealt with in accordance with the QUEENSLAND CHAMBER OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES SHOW RULES as stated on the Stanthorpe Agricultural Society's website at <https://www.stanthorpeshowgrounds.com.au/general-regulations>.

## **JOHNE'S DISEASE**

Queensland is classed as a Protected Zone for Johne's Disease. Interstate exhibitors must check with their local Department of Agriculture to confirm their John's status and eligibility to enter Queensland. A Health Certificate and Travelling Stock Statement must be obtained prior to entry to Queensland.

## **TICK ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

The Stanthorpe Showgrounds is situated in a cattle tick free area of Queensland. All stock entering these grounds must be tick free.

## **TICK INFECTED AREA**

Exhibitors must contact their local DAF at least two (2) weeks in advance to ensure all required paperwork to the show to arrange necessary treatments/paperwork.

## **TICK FREE AREAS**

Require a completed NVD.

## **INTERSTATE LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS**

Exhibitors should contact their local Department of Agriculture at least two (2) weeks in advance to confirm entry and exit requirements and obtain necessary paperwork.
