Find STANTHORPE SHOW 2026 and click PROCEED TO ENTRIES.

Entry fees (open): \$1.00 per item. Entry fees (youth – u18): 50c per item.
Fees to be paid when delivering entries, please have the correct money.

Prizes for all classes

Winner receives \$10.00 cash or voucher. Second place getter receives \$5.00 cash or voucher.
Champion in each subsection: Winner receives a gift. The winner of the 'best use of colour in a quilt' receives a gift.

Delivery of entries

Received at the exhibition centre between 8:30am to 12 noon on Wednesday 28/01/2026

Judging

Judging will take place at 1:00pm on Wednesday 28/01/2026

Collection of entries

Entries to be collected between 10:00am to 11:00am Sunday 1/02/2026

Gate admission fees apply on Friday & Saturday. Stanthorpe Agricultural Society members free.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – GENERAL

1. A separate entry form is required for each Stitchcraft subsection (forms can be photocopied).
2. A garment is something that you wear. An article is something that you carry.
3. Stewards reserve the right to move an exhibit to another category if in the judge's opinion it is in the wrong category or to combine categories if insufficient entries are received in that section.
4. All exhibits must be the work of the entrant and not more than two (2) years old.
5. **Judge's decisions are final, and prizes are awarded at the judge's discretion.**
6. Second prize money will not be paid unless there are at least 3 entries in a class and any vouchers awarded are not transferable.
7. Unclaimed prizes will be regarded as lapsed and all monies will become a donation to Stanthorpe Ag. Society if not collected within 3 months of show ending.
8. **Exhibits which have gained prizes in previous Stanthorpe Shows are excluded from entry.**
9. No more than 2 entries in any class by one person.
10. **Cleanliness is essential, and entries will be received at steward's discretion.**
11. All care is taken with entries but responsibility for insurance rests with exhibitors.
12. If entries are posted please ensure that return postage is included with fees and signed entry form correctly completed.
13. Exhibits not collected on Sunday following the show – please contact the chief steward or stewards.
14. YOUTH CLASSES are for those under 18 and age must be stated on the entry form.
15. Exhibitors must not remove items from display without steward being in attendance.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - QUILTS

16. It is requested that all quilts be presented in a bag with name and phone number visible on the outside and rod pockets will be needed on larger quilts and wall hangings.
17. Commercial quilting is permitted but must be acknowledged on entry form.
18. Originality of design should be acknowledged.
19. Champion quilt of show is eligible for Representative Class as an Affiliated Show Society entry in "Quilts across Australia" at the Ekka in August.
20. Suitable cotton garments will be eligible for entry in "Cotton creations" or "Kids in cotton" also.
